

Nicholas E. Bramble “Ironman” Scholarship Application



Nicholas Bramble was 19 years old when he lost his battle to Acute Myeloid Leukemia (AML). He was a 2004 graduate of St. Michaels High School. He attended school in Easton until 10th grade at which time he transferred to St. Michaels. Nicholas at a very young age set a goal to carry the game baseball as far as he possibly could. Although he was very active in soccer, hunting, etc. baseball was his true love. Nicholas played baseball and soccer all the way through high school and had been recruited to play on the Randolph-Macon College baseball team in Ashland, Va. Nicholas' journey through his high school years was one of many painful physical obstacles that he would have to overcome. Then in the fall of 2004, Nicholas was diagnosed with AML. He battled leukemia for 14 months, never once complaining, until he succumbed to the disease on Nov. 22, 2005. He faced his obstacles with great determination, strength, and courage. He taught everyone around him to live life with grace and character.
